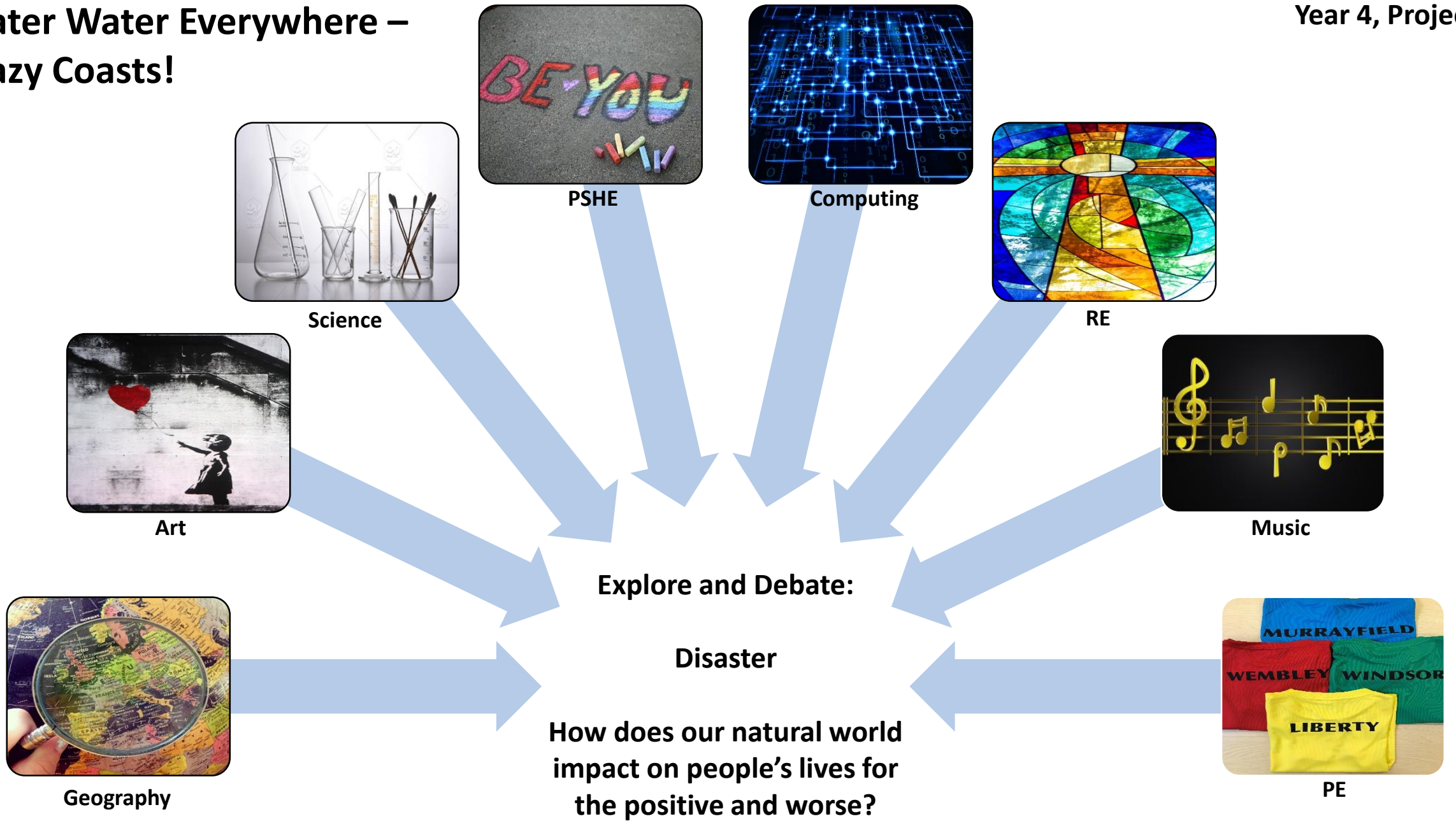


# Water Water Everywhere – Crazy Coasts!



## Project Outcomes:



**This final project in year 4 links with the previous project centred around water and how to stay safe. For this project the children study the concept of disaster, evaluating of the impact of the natural world on people’s lives. They begin to show empathy and understanding of how people, who have experienced disasters such as flooding and tsunami, have been affected. The children suggest ways that we could support people at times of disaster, and discuss and debate whose responsibility it is to rebuild the lives, homes destroyed by natural disasters.**

Spiritual Outcomes:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• We empathise with people who face disaster in their lives due to natural disasters.</li><li>• We reflect on how fortunate we are to live in an area that, by comparison to others, is safe from natural disaster.</li></ul>
Moral Outcomes:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• We discuss and debate whose responsibility it is to rebuild the lives and homes destroyed by disaster, making reasoned contributions and judgements.</li></ul>
Social Outcomes:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• We work together to learn about how we can protect ourselves and our homes from natural disasters involving water (floods etc).</li><li>• We discuss and debate issues and are confident to use language such as ‘I agree because...’ and ‘I would like to challenge your thoughts because...’. We are able to do this in a respectful manner.</li></ul>
Cultural Outcomes:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• We learn how, as a country, we support people who experience natural disasters as well as the impact we can have as individuals to support others less fortunate than ourselves.</li><li>• We explore the concept of divine through Christian Miracle stories and discuss and debate how religious beliefs support people in difficult times.</li></ul>
