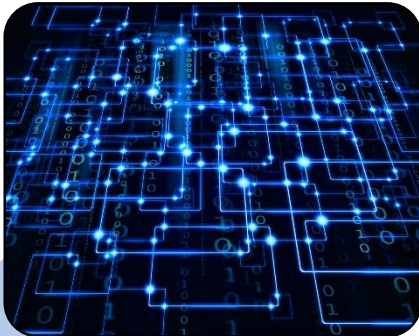

Explore and Debate:

Perception

We should always believe what we hear and see as significant for personal and collaborative growth.

Project Outcomes:



Beginning by learning about the Vikings, the children examine the concept of perception and whether they should always believe what they see and hear. They discuss and debate whether the Vikings are typically portrayed as they truly behaved.

Children are challenged to consider their perceptions of social situations in their lives – do they automatically believe what a peer tells them? – and also consider the role of mobile phones and social media in this.

Spiritual Outcomes:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We explore and evaluate our own and other people’s beliefs about the Vikings.• We reflect on our perceptions developing an understanding that this is not always a reality
Moral Outcomes:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We understand that we are the leader of our choices and are able to think through and recognise the likely impact of our behaviour and use this to make good choices.• We understand the consequences of sharing our perceptions in our social situations and through social media and endeavour to make good choices.
Social Outcomes:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• If we are using mobile phones and social media, we do so responsibly.• We think carefully about our words and actions, giving consideration as to how they may be perceived.• We speak and listen carefully and maturely when resolving conflicts, recognising when we can solve problems ourselves and when we need help.
Cultural Outcomes:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We learn about Umma and its significance in the Islamic Faith.• We understand how people in different faiths show their commitment.
