We also started some of our foundation units and spent Thursday afternoon preparing for our Geography work by exploring what lines of latitude and longitude are and how they help us pinpoint locations on the globe. It's tricky to get your head around the fact that lines of longitude run north/south but describe positions east/west (and vice-versa), but by the end of the afternoon the class were able to read coordinates and find different places around the world. This afternoon we kicked off our Art unit by exploring what 'installation' art means, and also put out team work skills to the test in PSHE by seeing who could make the tallest tower out of newspaper in PSHE. Well done to Marla, Izzy, Parker and Oscar, who were the winning team! They demonstrated excellent cooperation and collaboration.

Each week in these updates we'll also celebrate success, and today I would like to say a massive well done to all of the children for having such an amazing week! However, I would like say an extra congratulations to Lydia, who was nominated our class star of the week. She received nominations for always working hard, being kind to others as well as having beautiful presentation.

Luca is my own star this week for pushing himself out of his comfort zone and challenging himself to try new things. This was evidenced when completing the geography work on longitude and latitude. Luca was convinced he wouldn't be able to do it but proved himself wrong and the rest of us right (as we all knew he would)!
