Week Beginning: 18th September 2023



Good afternoon Class Loyal families,

Another week has flown by in Class Loyal, with hard work, great collaboration and creative ideas in abundance!

This morning, the children were very excited to receive the name of their Year 3 buddy/buddies. They have been working really hard all week to finish their guide to Ranvilles which, once published, they will share with their buddy/buddies. As part of the writing process, the children have been focusing on making their writing flow — by using a range of sentence types — whilst ensuring it is both informative and engaging. They shared plenty of good advice in their guide, putting themselves back in the shoes of a Year 3 and considering the key information and advice that would have helped them.

In maths, we reached the end of our unit of work on number and place value, which can only mean one thing... the big problem!
