## Weekly Learning Reflections

## Week Beginning:

In English this week we have been developing our sentence skills. First, we re-capped how to correctly punctuate sentences before identifying the similarities and differences in statements, questions and commands. We have learnt how to use a dictionary to find the definition of words and check spellings before finishing the week focusing on coordinating conjunctions to join together two main clauses. All this was topped up with daily reading of our new class text 'The Tortoise and The Hare - The Rematch', learning how to use prefixes in our spelling sessions and building our cursive writing skills. A very busy week in English indeed!

Music was magical this week. Continuing with our ballad topic, the children watched a heart-warming animation about a girl helping a little boy fix his plane, so that he could join his family in the sky to deliver a star. They practised the skill of listening carefully the music; noting how it changed in melody, rhythm and tone to convey different emotions. In preparation for composing our own ballad soon (which we're very excited about). The children created a story map of the animation – thinking of powerful words and phrases to write our lyrics with.

Perseverance was key in science this week as we learnt about muscles and their role in our bodies. We explored how they work together in pairs before learning more about prosthetic and bionic limbs. Our task for the lesson was to build our own 'skeleton-hand' that show how muscles and bones work together to help us move. Although the children were amazing at listening to and carrying out the instructions – time got the better of us and we didn't quite finish the fiddly task. We will get it done next week.
