It has been another very busy week for us in Victory this week. It was lovely to see so many of you at parents evening and I hope you found it informative and useful. The children have continued to work hard in order produce work they are proud of and they are looking forward to sharing their work with you next week at the open morning.

The Jungle Book has continued to be our focus for English with the children planning their diary entry from Mowgli's point of view. We have focused on a range of emotions and looked at vocabulary that will help us show these through our diaries. The children have been challenged to improve their word choice and there have been some good examples of up levelling words.

Addition and subtraction has taken over our Maths focus now and we have begun to explore how to estimate answers and calculate efficiently. The children are beginning to grasp the fact that calculations can be made simple by counting on or taking away one from each side. We have worked on securing complements to 100 and then choosing which methods are best to use.

Across the curriculum the children have continued to practise their creative skills through Art and Music. They worked hard to explore different mediums of painting to see what effects they could create. In Music, they are practising Samba beats along with different rhythms working towards being able to perform a class piece.
