The end of week four has arrived and once again the children have worked incre to do their best across the curriculum. They have shown good attitudes towards their learning and have shown good enthusiasm across the range of subjects we have covered.

We have begun a new unit in English this week, exploring the world of the Jungle Book. The children have analysed diary entries to identify a success criteria and practised writing a range of sentences using different conjunctions. We are focusing on time conjunctions to fit with the chronological order of a diary.

Our final week on number and place value has seen us tackle rounding to the nearest 10 and 100 as well as continuing our tables work. The children have used number lines effectively and explored how they can help us answer a range of questions.

The curriculum has taken us into developing our Basketball skills into small games where the children have been challenged to show good co-operation and collaboration. In Computing, we have continued to explore Google programmes, this week focusing on slides and using our non-chronological reports to help us create presentations. We are also exploring the world of Samba music with the children practising different beats and rhythms to try and create a class piece by the end of the half-term.
