Lots of fantastic learning happening this week in class Astute!

In our history topic of The Stone Age, we've been wearing archaeologist hats to explore pre-historic houses and sorting artifacts into primary and secondary sources. We also studied virtual timelines to understand just how long ago the Stone Age was - a real eye opener for most of the children! The children also enjoyed viewing the famous stone-built Neolithic settlement Skara Brae in the Orkney Islands in 3D.

In maths, we focused on deepening our understanding of multiplication and division by using our knowledge to solve our big problem which was to 'escape the classroom'. I was so impressed to see the children actively collecting the resources they needed to help them and also from justifying their explanations with a 'because'. Super independent learners!

The most exciting part of our week had to be the start of rehearsals for our Christmas play Christmas Around the World. Once the children were given their parts, we immediately began to practise the songs and the children's lines in the hall.
