Class Astute have been up to lots this week in their learning. From exploring how people lived in the Stone Age at Butser Farm, to rehearsing their line dancing steps in PE to perform in cannon sequence!

Our history topic has also linked to our English writing where we soon will be creating our very own non-chronological report on a stone age creature. So far, we've deconstructed two non-chronological texts for features and powerful language, which we will then use in our writing.

Yesterday we explored forces and friction through practical investigations.
