What a whirlwind of a week it has been.

We have returned back after the half term break to embark on new projects across the curriculum and as ever it has been a busy one.

English this week linked well with Halloween as we created our own spooky poems. The children started by exploring structure and style of a range of poems before tackling figurative language. Excellent examples of personification, alliteration, similes and onomatopoeia transformed our classroom into a haunting environment. Today these we used to great effect as the children drafted their own poems.

Our Science focus this half term is 'forces'. This week the children experimented with moving a ping pong ball to discover that all contact force can be categorized into pushes, pulls and twists. We then tackled labelling scientific diagrams before developing our scientific vocabulary.

Monday saw a particular highlight of my week as our PE lesson focus was line dancing. The children formed lines across the hall and learnt a range of steps. The challenge was to stay in our lines as we moved back and forth. See if your child can remember: 'the fan', 'the heel toe' 'the step kick step tap' and 'the grapevine'

A very well done to everyone for surviving Thursdays impromptu home learning day. I was very impressed with the submissions on Google Classroom and know that more children worked hard but didn't upload. Home learning is a challenge for all so a pat on the back all round.
