Weekly Learning Reflections



Our second week back after half-term has been a good one and the children's learning has continued at pace. This week, we have focused on how we treat each other and ensuring that no matter who it is, we treat everyone equally. The children recognised situations where they may feel upset and are working hard to treat each other with kindness no matter who they are.

Our exploration of Roald Dahl's life has continued in English with the children applying their knowledge of him to write an in-depth and informative biography. They have looked at prepositional phrases to enhance their sentence work and have tried to apply this in their writing. We have also focused on ensuring the structure follows the chronological order of his life.

In Maths, we have continued to explore money, focusing on adding and subtracting amounts to find the total cost and the correct amount of change. Some difficulties were found when finding the right amount of change but spending time working with practise money has enabled the children to feel more confident and calculate with more accuracy.

We have continued to explore the Amazon rainforest, travelling through the layers and discovering what creatures lurk at different levels. The children have continued to explore clothes and colours in French and have also explored symbols of different religions. There have been some fantastic answers to questions in RE and PSHE, where the children have linked their learning to our STARS and values and shown their understanding.
