It's been another busy week in class Astute! As we came to the end of our English learning journey on report writing, we began another – our Elf narratives. So far, we've studied the story 'The Elf and the Show Maker' and have role played the story to deepen our knowledge and understanding of it. Today, we developed our knowledge of the characters from using descriptive language to show the reader the elves appearance, not tell them. All of these skills will enable the children to write exciting and engaging narratives.

In maths, we've been building upon our knowledge of fractions by comparing, ordering and grouping fractions.
