Our Maths focus continues to be fractions with our attention turning to tenths and hundredths this week. The children have explored these as both fractions and decimals before learning how to convert between fractions and decimals. They have applied themselves well and it is pleasing to see them grasping these concepts at a relatively quick pace.

The curriculum has continued at pace this week with the children investigating the food miles of various different foods, exploring how sound travels and the effect distance has on the volume of a sound as well as practising their balance and mindfulness during our yoga sessions.
