## Weekly Learning Reflections

## Week Beginning: 6<sup>th</sup> May 2024

Good evening Class Loyal families,

What a wonderful sunny week we have enjoyed this week! It makes such a difference enabling the children to benefit from plenty of fresh air and exercise, particularly in a busy week like this one!

Despite the long weekend, they arrived on Tuesday morning raring to go. A highlight for me was Science on Tuesday afternoon when we investigated heart rate and the pattern between the size of different animals and their heart rates. Class Loyal are such an inquisitive bunch and always enjoy our science lessons, bringing their own knowledge to our enquiries but always being keen and hungry to learn more about the world around them.

We also developed our French learning further by discovering the French for different items of clothing. With our topic being 'Going on holiday', this lesson was all about packing our suitcase and the items we wanted to take with us. The French dictionaries came in very useful when the children realised that the vocabulary list provided included 'toothbrush - *brosse à dents*' but not 'toothpaste' which, of course, was a must pack item!

The technique for the throwing events is absolutely key and the session enabled them to practise throwing the discus, vortex and shot put before listening to feedback from their partner and attempting to improve their distance each time. Such great collaboration between many of the children enabled clear and precise feedback to be received and built upon. Well done!

This week the children really have shown me their best, as they have polished their skills ready for our SATs week next week. At Ranvilles, we pride ourselves on preparing the children well for the assessments, whilst maintaining our philosophy of giving them an enjoyable and engaging learning experience each day. I honestly feel they are ready to shine brightly next week. My favourite quote from the week has to be, "I'm actually really looking forward to it!" This takes me back to the beginning of the year, when many of the class had questions about SATs – this was definitely something they worried about in September.
