Week Beginning:

Happy Friday 😊

With the end of this week, we come to the half way point of the first half term – hasn't it flown by!

As ever, it has been a jam packed week of learning.

Today brought our English unit on 'After the Fall' to an end as the children finalised their version of the tale. It has been excellent to see them apply the skills that we have been practising over the past couple of weeks to their writing before taking time to edit and improve their work to make it the best it can be. I have a few left to read but I have been very impressed so far. On top of this we met our first Ranvilles Reading Master this week as we explored the role of Master Reporter. The children have used their skills to retrieve information from the text to 'copy and paste' into a written answer. More practise is needed but they produced excellent first attempts.

In maths this week, we have continued to extend our knowledge on number and place value with a particular focus on comparing and ordering numbers. We have explored the concept of greater than, less than and equal to, before moving onto finding 10 and 100 more or less of any 3 digit number. We finished the week developing our ordering skills in both ascending and descending order. Monday will see us tackling our first 'BIG PROBLEM' as the children help the local sporting competition sort their muddled up scores.

On top of our European Day of Language this week, our French lesson saw the children asking others how they are feeling before answering with one of 5 answers. Whilst in Geography we discovered the barren landscape of Antarctica by exploring the different features of this unusual climate. In Tuesday's PE the children continued to develop their skipping and running skills whereas Friday's PE focused on the chest and shoulder pass. All children showed excellent perseverance in both of these lessons.
