Week Beginning:

Another busy week has come to an end and, as ever, it has been jam packed.

After continuing to practise a wide range of reading and writing skills throughout the week, today we planned our first long write. The children worked in pairs to carefully sequence Humpty's story before considering magpied word choices, expanded noun phrases and conjunctions that could be used and added them to their plans. Next week the children will use these to draft their independent writing.

Number and place value has continued to be the theme in maths this week. The children have extended their knowledge of 3-digit numbers in a variety of ways aided by the use of concrete resources, pictorial representation and reasoning tasks. It has been excellent to see the children challenge themselves to apply mathematical language to their explanations as well as each other with tricky problems.

Our PSHE lesson focused on understanding relationships with our family, friends and peers. We explored what makes these relationships special, how they make us feel and how all relationships are reciprocal. We discussed how relationships are like gardens that need watering and caring for in order to flourish and be healthy. We finished the lesson by beginning to explore strategies to maintain positive relationships and how to resolve conflicts.

On top of this we have continued to develop skipping and ball control in our PE lessons, defined and compared climates around the world in Geography and learnt about shading with tone in art.
