Week Beginning: 12 January 2025

Week two has come and gone and it is great to see the children settling so quickly back into the routines of school. They are being challenged and pushed everyday to be the best they can and it is excellent to see so many of them rising to the challenge.

This week, we have explored different setting descriptions of Diagon Alley in order to determine which ones are good examples and which ones need improving. Then the children focused on planning their own description before practising using a variety of sentences and skills to describe.

Completing our time unit this week, the children have practised using their tables knowledge to convert between months and years, days and weeks. Following on from this, they explored using number lines to work out durations of time before applying all their learning in solving the Harry Potter Big Problem.

Continuing our curriculum, the children have investigated the differences between Iron-Age and Anglo-Saxon settlements and explored what a solid is by looking at different materials and identifying their common features. The children also spent time looking at what makes a dare and how to respond when a friend dares us to do something we know isn't right. It has been fantastic to see great application across the curriculum and children shining in their own areas of talent.
