A particular highlight for all children this week has been our DT day. We started the morning by exploring the definition of importing and exporting foods as well as seasonality. They then had the opportunity to taste test a range of seasonal veggies before designing a vegetable tart to the specification of a design brief from a local restaurant. Some were incredibly surprised to find that they actually did like raw versions of the veg offered!

The children then showcased their independence to complete a range of tasks whilst the knives came out to learn a range of chopping skills in small groups. We developed our bridge and claw holds to chop up mushroom, courgettes and peppers. Before lunch we made the tarts and sent them off to the kitchen before finishing our morning tasks off. During the afternoon they enjoyed and evaluated their creations. The children showed exemplar behaviour throughout the day and I definitely encourage the use of their chopping skills to help you with cooking dinner over half term!
