What a fantastically busy first week back it's been. Lots to celebrate in our learning this week, from exploring the Romans to testing our fitness, we have certainly had a jam-packed week of learning!

For our new learning journey in English, we now look to newspaper reports. So far, the children have read newspaper texts about volcanic eruptions and the devastation they cause in preparation to write their very own on a different volcanic eruption. It's been brilliant to see the children apply their already impressive knowledge of volcanos from last terms geography unit! We have deconstructed these examples for features whilst also refreshing our learning on speech using ICAP1.
