Another week complete and once again, the children in Victory have been working hard and persevering in their learning. It has been lovely to see them rising to the challenges set for them and competing against themselves to improve daily.

Stepping into Isabelle's shoes, the children have contemplated how key events in her life would make them feel, sharing their emotions as diary entries portraying the emotional rollercoaster she experienced in the story. Accuracy has been the focus in Maths this week with the children challenged to use column subtraction to work out tricky calculations. Using the inverse calculation to check their answers has helped the children identify errors before applying their understanding to help them solve word problems.

Entering the world of food once again, the children researched the ingredients from some of their favourite food choices to explore how many food miles are involved in getting it to them. They've also practised drawing graphs to represent data gathered in investigations. Channelling their inner Mozart, the children composed a melody to complement their haiku and have spent time exploring different note combinations for the greatest effect.
